Thesis:

- Intro: 1. Water, while necessary, can cause tremendous amounts of damage and can be deadly.
 - 2. Events such as floods, hurricanes, tsunami's, cause tremendous damage and loss of life. (Several slides until "what kind of food was it slide).
- I. What kind of Flood was it?
 - A. How would you describe a local flood?
 - 1. What kind of words, descriptions & details would you use?
 - 2. The term flood in Genesis is unique when compared to how it is used elsewhere in the Bible.
 - B. How is the term flood used in the Bible?

(The Term flood is used about 35 times in the Bible.)

- i. 12 Times in Genesis chapters 6-11; used to refer to "The Great Flood"
- ii. 22 times in the Old Testament, it comes from a different Hebrew word.
- iii. The Hebrew word as found in Genesis 6-11, is the only Hebrew word used to describe "The Great Flood".
- iv. The N.T. uses a unique word to describe this event.
- a. The greek word used in the N.T. means "Cataclysm". This word is defined as "something that causes great destruction"; "a flood or deluge". (**Lk 17:27**)
- b. Luke 6:48 a flood local in nature; a different term than that used in Luke 17:27

II. The Completeness...

- A. of the flood (**Gen 6:17**)
 - 1. The word "all" is used 30 times, the world "every" is used 37 times.
 - 2. Notice also the absence of "limiting words"; such as local, regional, partial, portion, few, & some.

AA. of destruction

- 1. Genesis 6:7
- 2. **Genesis 6:17** (slide of flood waters after verse)
- B. of preservation
 - 1. Noah & His Family on the ark
 - 2. The Animals on the ark (Genesis 6:19-20)

C. of coverage

- 1. Gen 7:19-20, all the hills under the whole heaven where covered.
 - a. The mountains where covered by 15 cubits of water. Remember the creatures sent out to find land? (slide of the dove; **Genesis 8:6-9**)
- 2. the whole earth covered (Gen 8:9; image of water covered earth afterwards)
- D. Of the Promise of Preservation
 - 1. the promise (**Gen 9:16**)

- III. What we learn about the flood from the size of the ark.
 - a. The size of the ark implies the totality of the flood.
 - b. If the flood was local, such large vessel, with all animals, etc would not be necessary.
 - c. A local flood would of allowed the animals to simply migrate to another area.
 - d. A local flood would of allowed Noah's family to simply move to higher ground.
 - B. Scientific Evidence of a Global Flood
 - 1. Fossils around the world, showing rapid burial in water deposited layers.
 - 2. Such layers are found around the world.
 - a. all of which show sudden, and complete, destructive forces.
 - b. From low elevation regions (Sahara desert), to higher elevation areas of the Tibetan plateau in Asia.
 - c. From deep caves (in North America) & even in Antarctica.
 - C. Ancient Stories of a "Great Flood"
